About The San Francisco Survey

- The San Francisco Survey is a project of the Committee on Jobs, conducted by EMC Research. Our goals are to develop an on-going tool to gauge public opinion and to help inform elected officials and interested parties of the public's views on policy issues. The San Francisco Survey uses an open and transparent platform and will release the results of each of the surveys it conducts.
- In addition to providing survey results, the San Francisco Survey will release demographic and voter data on a regular basis to help inform policy discussions in San Francisco.



Methodology

- Web Survey of San Francisco Voters
- Offered in English, Chinese, and Spanish
- Demographics closely match the demographics of the registered voters in the city

*Surveys only offered in English and Chinese.


Key Findings

- Voter pessimism continues to rise, with unhappiness and anxiety growing.
- Homelessness is rising as a top concern along with cost of living and housing, and is now identified by over half of voters as one of the city's biggest problems.



Right Direction/Wrong Track

Overall optimism is down, while pessimism continues to rise.




Q3. Do you think things in San Francisco are generally going in the right direction, or do you feel that things are pretty seriously off on the wrong track?



San Francisco Attitudes

Unhappiness and anxiety around changes in SF are on the rise.

I am unhappy or worried about changes happening in San Francisco




Do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

Excited about Future/Worried about Changes

The percentage who are excited but not worried is shrinking, while the percentage who are worried but not excited is growing, signaling a significant mood shift in SF.






San Francisco Attitudes

The vast majority still agree that SF is a good place to live, but intensity of opinion continues to decline.


San Francisco is a good place to live

Do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?


20. I am likely to move out of San Francisco in the next few years

Homelessness is now selected by over half as one of SF's top 3 problems.



Homelessness is a rising as the most important problem in San Francisco.







Cost of living, housing, crime and homelessness are on the rise as top mentioned problems in San Francisco neighborhoods.





Addressing homelessness and supporting public schools are top priorities.




Q21-28. On a scale from 1 to 7, where 1 is not at all important and 7 is extremely important, how important do you feel each of the following should be in San Francisco right now?

Supporting local schools and addressing homelessness continue to be top priorities for San Francisco voters.




Q21-28. On a scale from 1 to 7, where 1 is not at all important and 7 is extremely important, how important do you feel each of the following should be in San Francisco right now?
